## **Bureau of the Census Age Search**

The U.S. Census Bureau offers a service that searches 1910-2000 census records in order to locate the record of a person needing proof of age, citizenship, relationship, social security benefits, retirement benefits, passports, identification cards and genealogy. The request for a search must contain the signature of the person to whom the search pertains or proof of death from a direct bloodline relative. If a record is located for that person, we provide an official transcript of the census record which contains the applicant's name, relationship to the head of household, age at the time of the census, place of birth and citizenship for the census year searched. 1960 census and later do not list place of birth or citizenship. Census records are located by geographic location at the time of the census, not by name. In order to locate a person's record, we must have the address/specific location where the person lived on census day for the census year that they want searched.

The current fee that is charged for this service is \$65, which pays for the search of one census year for one person and the preparation of a transcript if a record is located. Check their website for forms that may be printed in order to submit a request for a search.

The Riley County Historical Museum features changing and on-going exhibits on the history of Riley County. On the grounds of the museum are the Hartford House, an 1855 prefabricated house that came on the Hartford steamboat, the Bala bell, and the Randolph Jail, a 19<sup>th</sup> century jail from Randolph, Kansas. The museum houses a collection of over 30,000 objects. The museum also sponsors educational programs for both children and adults and a Speakers bureau. The museum's Seaton Library/Charlson-Taylor Archives holds a collection of over 4,000 monographic titles, 200 periodical titles, 2,500 cubic feet of manuscripts and archival materials, and 6,000 negatives and images. The collection focuses on Riley County and Kansas history. A limited check-out collection is available to teachers and others. The library/archive is open by appointment.

The Kansas State Historical Society's Goodnow House Museum, a National Register property and a state historic site, is adjacent to the Riley County Historical Museum. The Goodnow House was the home of a founder of the city of Manhattan. Although currently closed, the Goodnow House is expected to reopen during the summer of 2011.
